## **Winter Trip** **Fun in the Mountains**

We will travel by van to Carrabassett Valley in western Maine where we will trek by snowshoes or nordic skis to Flagstaff Hut. Flagstaff Hut is one of three huts in the Maine Huts and Trails system. During the 1.8 mile trek we will enjoy some of Maine's beautiful landscape before arriving at a well-appointed, highly-efficient backcountry hut, where we can enjoy a hot shower, a private room for our group and a delicious home-cooked meal. We will explore around the hut during the afternoon and second morning before making our way back to the van. Once back on the road we will travel to Bethel, Maine where we will spend the night in the bunkhouse at the Chapman Inn. This is another great facility where we can cook dinner and enjoy another relaxed night of games. The last day we will tackle the snow in a different way at Sunday River Ski area. Either by skis or snowboard, we will spend the day letting gravity take us down the slopes. Don't worry if you have never been before because we are glad to help!

Trip fees can often be paid in full, or in-part, by DHHS allocated camp funding. Please contact your caseworker ASAP and let them know you are interested. There may also be post adoption funds available.
